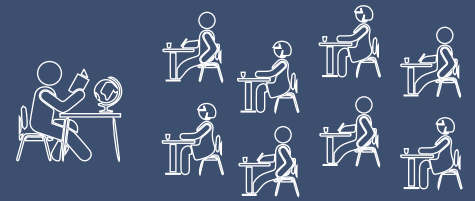


TEACHING IN THE 'NEW NORMAL'
